The Sick Kids Centre for Community Mental Health (SK CCMH), formerly *The Hincks-Dellcrest Centre*, is a community-based children's mental health centre providing prevention & early intervention, outpatient assessment and treatment, in-home support, day treatment, and residential services to children ages birth to 18 years. The Centre is integrated with The Hospital for Sick Children's (HSC) in-patient and ambulatory mental health services for children. The Centre is an accredited teaching facility affiliated with the University of Toronto.

We are currently seeking an applicant for a 12-month contract, FTE 0.6, who has experience conducting comprehensive psychological assessments involving cognitive, academic, and social-emotional measures for children ages 5 – 18 years. The successful applicant will provide psychological assessments to clients of SK CCMH who are experiencing a range of complex mental health, behavioural and learning challenges. In addition to conducting comprehensive psychological assessments, this position will involve working closely with clinicians, clinical teams and other professionals working with the child and family in order to integrate the assessment results, feedback and clinical & educational recommendations for the children and families. The successful candidate will report to the Director, Specialized Services and Academic Leadership.

Key Responsibilities:

- Conducts comprehensive psychological assessments or consultations for children and adolescents ages approximately 5 – 18 years
- Collaborates with the family, the clinician, and/or inter-professional clinical teams to integrate assessment results to support treatment planning & educational planning
- Provides some case management and liaison services to children and families as needed
- Assists in the selection and maintenance of high quality assessment tools
- Ensures that provided services are carried out in accordance with Centre policies, procedures, and standards including those related to case management, documentation, and reports
- Completes all client documentation (including, but not limited to, contact notes, assessment reports, incident reports/serious occurrence reports, etc.) in a timely and succinct manner and ensures it meets agency, professional, and legal standards
- Ensures that all required client tracking and statistical information is submitted per agency procedures & requirements
- Maintains up-to-date professional development that is relevant to the position and the Centre's mission & mandate
- Participates in relevant meetings, reports regularly and as required by the designated supervisor

Qualifications:

- The minimum level of education required to fulfill the core requirements of this position is a Doctoral Degree in Psychology, registration with the *College of Psychologists of Ontario*, and declared competency in clinical psychology with children, adolescents, and families
- Well-developed skills in assessment and knowledge of a variety of clinical interventions are essential
- A minimum of three years previous related clinical experience in the various major responsibility areas is preferred
- School-based experience would be considered an asset
- Social and multicultural sensitivity

This position will require that:

- Work hours may need to be flexible and extended to meet the needs of the clients (i.e., evening work)
- This position requires some travel between at least two of the Centre's sites (Sheppard & Keele, Church & Wellesley).
