



PSYCHOLOGICAL CONSULTANT - SPECIALIZED SUPPORT TEAM (SST) - ITINERANT

SALARY/VACATION:

Qualified Ph.D. Grid: \$70,983 to \$89,899 per annum (based on a full-time 35-hour per week position)

FTE/HOURS: 1.0FTE; 35 hours per week; permanent

RESPONSIBILITIES:

This position will lead the Specialized Support Team in the development of comprehensive collaborative school based plans to support student success. The SST works with a multi-disciplinary team along with school staff, family members, and community partners to provide support to schools for students with significant mental health and behavioural needs.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Graduate degree in Psychology is the minimum requirement
- Registered Psychologist or Psychological Associate (or in the process of registering) in clinical/educational psychology is preferred

REQUIRED SKILLS AND EXPERIENCE:

- Creating and implementing mental health/behaviour plans in collaboration with school teams, parents, students and community partners
- Consultation and coaching skills
- Demonstrated ability to work with students and families with complex needs and a variety of community and school supports
- Demonstrated leadership abilities
- Knowledge of children's mental health disorders (i.e. Anxiety, ASD, Conduct Disorder, AD/HD, Depression, ODD)
- Thorough knowledge of mental health and behaviour intervention strategies
- Demonstrated ability to develop rapport with teachers, students, parents and community professionals

ASSETS:

- Therapeutic intervention skills (particularly individual and family systems therapy)
- Training in collaborative proactive solutions
- Able to develop rapport with teachers, students, parents and community professionals
- Knowledge regarding physical intervention strategies (i.e. BMS)
- Strong organizational and time management skills
