

**Part-Time Clinical Neuropsychologist – Neuropsychology Clinic  
Community Head Injury Resource Services of Toronto**

CHIRS is looking to hire one part-time Neuropsychologist, for a one year position. Individuals interested in obtaining post-doctoral supervision in neuropsychology will be considered. CHIRS is a registered not-for-profit charitable organization primarily funded by the Central Local Health Integration Network and the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-term Care. CHIRS provides support services to over 400 people with moderate to severe acquired brain injuries with diverse and complex needs. We maintain active research and clinical partnerships with the Centre for Addictions and Mental Health as well as community based agencies addressing homelessness and serious mental health.

The Neuropsychology Clinic at CHIRS is dedicated to providing evidence-based, client-centered programming, to pursue our mission of enhancing the lives of people who have been affected by acquired brain injury. Neuropsychological evaluations are done with internal clients, subsidized community clients, and fee for service (medical-legal) clients. Patient population includes adults with a history of an acquired brain injury (predominately moderate-severe). Support from a psychometrist is available.

**Position Requirements:**

- Ph.D. or Psy.D. in Psychology with valid registration with the College of Psychologists of Ontario (i.e., C.Psych.); proof of professional liability insurance
- Declared competence in the area of Neuropsychology (Adults) (second competence in the area of clinical or rehabilitation psychology desirable).
- Conduct neuropsychological evaluations with internal clients, subsidized community clients, and fee for service (medical-legal) clients
- Assess and diagnose behavioural, emotional, and cognitive conditions of clients living with the effects of acquired brain injury
- Counsel clients related to behavior and cognitive processes
- Extensive knowledge of psychometric tests and neuropsychological assessment procedures appropriate for use with a brain-injury population
- Ability to communicate effectively and work collaboratively with clients, family and community support workers
- Develop and deliver trainings to assist staff to understand and work with ABI clients
- Participate in multi-disciplinary team meetings to review and discuss cases, secure and offer advice concerning residents and provide input into team and operational issues
