What can I expect to do in this role?

- conduct individual, group and family therapies and crisis intervention;
- provide consultation and recommendations to team members and facility management;
- design and conduct research projects;
- supervise and evaluate treatment programs.

How do I qualify?

Mandatory

- You have a PhD in Psychology from a university of recognized standing.
- You are registered in good standing as a Psychologist in the Province of Ontario or you are eligible to be on the temporary registrar with the College of Psychologists in Ontario.

Specialized Knowledge and Skills

- You have knowledge of psychology, current rehabilitative, treatment and assessment techniques, practices and theories applicable to youth.
- You have knowledge of psychological assessment tools and techniques, and their application to youth population.
- You have knowledge of the application and interpretation of assessment instruments.
- You have knowledge of program evaluation and research techniques to evaluate program effectiveness, develop and conduct research projects.
- You have knowledge of the professional standards of practice and relevant legislation (e.g., consent to treatment, care and retention of records, Health Disciplines Act, Mental Health Act, privacy and confidentiality).

Communication and Interpersonal Skills

- You can work effectively within a multidisciplinary setting and maintain strong working relationships.
- You can communicate information regarding psychological assessment approaches, findings, and treatment/rehabilitative activities to internal and external stakeholders.
- You can conduct therapy and counseling sessions, and assist in the professional supervision of placement students.

Analytical and Problem Solving Skills

- You can provide diagnostic assessments to formulate, deliver and evaluate treatment, crisis intervention and rehabilitation plans and programs.
